

2021 SAILING PROGRAMS

Basic Sailing Class - Mate A

The basic sailing class consists of two evenings of classroom instruction, as well as land drills and one all-day practical on-the-water lesson. The course will be instructed on the American 146 Day Sailor and the Rhodes 19' sailboat.



This Mate A instruction will include elements of boating safety, parts of the boat, knot tying, sails and sailing theory. Practical instruction will include sailing all points of sail, leaving and returning to the dock, man overboard and capsized recovery.

A U.S. Sailing Small Boat Sailing Certification will be issued after successful completion of the course. Classes begin on Thursday 6-9pm, Friday 6-9pm, Saturdays 9-3pm and Sundays 9-12 are built in weather backup days.

Keelboat Sailing Class - Skipper B

This Intermediate Sailing Class consists of two evening sessions (including classroom and pier side instruction), one full day of practical sailing, and one half day of written exam and practical sailing.



This course will cover heavy weather sailing, crew briefing, operation of a boat under auxiliary power, reefing, and quick stop method of man overboard recovery.

A majority of the class will be off shore beyond the confines of Great Lakes Harbor sailing the Colgate 26' sailboat. A U.S. Navy Sailing Association Level B Certification will be issued after demonstration of all practical requirements and the passing of the written exam. Classes begin on Thursday 6-9pm, Friday 6-9pm, Saturdays 9-3pm, and Sunday 9-12pm.
